

President and CEO Monthly Report to CHC Board of Directors August 19, 2024

Reporting period: June 21st – August 16th 2024

- Community Health Center Funding:
 - Ongoing advocacy for stable and predictable multi-year funding that incorporates inflationary economics.
 - No SC Members of Congress have signed on the to FY2025 Appropriations Letter.
- Congressionally Directed Spending Request:
 - Total 2025 Requests = 22,345
 - Senator Graham submitted 98 requests ranging from \$120,000 to \$112,100,000 for a total of \$527,419,000.
 - Funding categories include:
 - Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and related agencies;
 - Commerce, Justice, Science, and related agencies;
 - Energy and Water Development;
 - Homeland Security;
 - Interior, Environment, and related agencies;
 - Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and related agencies; and
 - Military Construction, Veteran's Affairs, and related agencies;
 - Transportation, Housing, Urban Development, and related agencies.

Current 340B "State of Play"

- "340B Affording Care for Communities and Ensuring a Strong Safety-net Act" "340B ACCESS ACT":
 - No movement expected before end of Session at which time the bill will die.
- "Supporting Underserved and Strengthening Transparency, Accountability, and Integrity Now for the Future of 340B ACT" "SUSTAIN 340B Act":
 - Planned introduction prior to August recess was held at the 11th hour.
 - After a brief "cone of silence" the staff of the Senate Gang of Six (G6) are regrouping.
 - It is "rumored" that one point of discord is related to STI eligibility without direct patient care responsibility.
 - 340B Working Table continues to serve as primary behind the curtain advisory group to G6.
 - Based on some intel providing, SV has been asked to provide more detailed analysis on emerging practice to expand capture inappropriately to the benefit of for-profit 3rd parties.
 - 340B Working Table met with staff leadership for House Energy and Commerce in preparation for building companion legislation.
- Drug manufacturers continue to introduce new policies, requirements, and restrictions that are increasing the threat to covered entities and creating additional operational challenges:
 - The most threatening: conversion from an upfront drug discount to a retroactive rebate.
 - Previous threat to restrict 340B at entity owned stand alone pharmacies has been quieted.

Other Federal Advocacy Activities:

- Served as Meeting Chair for July meeting of the South Carolina Business Council:
 - Provided overview of the Community Health Center Program and South Carolina's health centers.
 - Introduced Congressman Nancy Mace.
- Attended South Carolina Congressional Prayer Breakfast:
 - Opportunity to interact with full delegation with the exception of Congressman Clyburn and Senator Graham.
- Multiple visits on the Hill in addition to 340B Working Table work sessions and Hill meetings.

- HRSA Behavioral Health Service Expansion submitted.

Administration Department:


- Work is underway to renovate annex space and relocate Development and Corporate Compliance staff to open additional space in main Administration Office.
